## Keele University goes green(er)

An innovative green energy trial that could help dramatically cut carbon emissions has been given the go-ahead on Keele University campus. The HyDeploy project, which could open the door to a low-carbon hydrogen economy and pave the way to saving six million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions in the UK every year, has been given the go-ahead by the Health and Safety Executive (HSE).

The HyDeploy project builds on the University's other landmark sustainability projects, such as its work with businesses, academics and graduates to create Europe's first 'at scale' <a href="mailto:smart energy network demonstrator">smart energy network demonstrator</a> — where new energy-efficient technologies can be researched, developed and tested in a real-world environment.

Professor Mark Ormerod, Deputy Vice-Chancellor and Provost at Keele University, said: "Energy and sustainability is a key overarching institutional priority for Keele

important, highly relevant and prestigious project. HyDeploy will tackle one of the major societal challenges and has the potential to be highly impactful and lead to a significant reduction in carbon emissions."
