Business innovation programme announces second phase

A programme that has supported more than 150 Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire businesses to innovate and grow has announced a second phase.

The <u>Keele Research and Innovation Support Programme (KRISP</u>)* sees academics, professionals and students from Keele University working in collaboration with local businesses to develop new products, services and processes.

The second phase, which will be incorporated within the Smart Innovation Hub* project and is also part-funded through the European Regional Development Fund, was announced at an event on 10 April and will enable a further 200 local businesses to be supported between June 2019 and December 2021.

Through the KRISP programme, businesses are paired with a talented student or

Development and Innovation Associate. Along with staff who have sector-relevant experience, all parties work together on a specific project that will benefit the growth and development of the company.



Rob McKay, KRISP Project Manager, said: "This second phase of the programme will enable us to build on the success that we've achieved with SMEs in the local area over the past couple of years.

"Through the support that the programme has made available and accessible, local businesses have been able to bring innovative products and services to market faster than would have otherwise been possible, providing a valuable contribution to the Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire economy."

Report highlights role of Keele research in driving a new low carbon economic future

The region is uniquely placed to lead the quest for clean growth, according to a new report published by the Government.

One of a series of Science and Innovation Audits (SIAs) commissioned by the Government, the 'Clean and Sustainable Growth' report shows a 'Coastal Arc' stretching from Cumbria to North Wales, and including Staffordshire, Cheshire



and Lancashire, that has both a strong track record for driving clean and sustainable growth on a global scale and significant potential to be world-leading.

From leading-edge crop science to new energy systems and pioneering waste management techniques, the report highlights the many strengths which give the North West Coastal Arc Partnership a competitive edge in a world which is facing the need to make more efficient use of resources and shift to a low-carbon economy.

The audit identifies dozens of internationally-significant research and innovation assets within the region, with Keele cited as providing regional leadership in a number of key areas, such as the Smart Energy Network Demonstrator (SEND)* and the HyDeploy project.

Fully-funded leadership development

Keele University's Innovation Leadership programme is designed to support the development of local business leaders and entrepreneurs and equip them with the skills and knowledge to successfully tackle future challenges.

Incorporated within the Smart Innovation Hub*, the programme is open to owners, directors and senior managers of SMEs in Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire.

The fully-funded programme consists of six two-day facilitated group learning sessions, led by a mix of Keele University academics and expert business leaders. Participants will also have access to a dedicated Entrepreneur in Residence to provide coaching, advice and guidance on a one-to-one basis.

The next cohort will commence in May 2019, with only limited places now available. Sessions will initially take place at Keele Hall, before moving to the University's new Smart Innovation Hub when it opens later this year.
