


Smart Innovation Hub welcomes first tenants

A brand new multi-million pound state-of-the-art landmark building housing modern business accommodation and innovative support programmes has welcomed its first tenants.

Based at the entrance to Keele University's renowned <u>Science and Innovation</u> <u>Park</u>, the Smart Innovation Hub, which has been part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund*, offers a collaborative working environment which blends Keele's knowledgeable staff, talented students and expert academics with local business leaders and entrepreneurs, thanks to the Hub's unique co-location alongside the University's Business School.

Offering a range of lettable modern private offices, shared spaces and co-working environments, the Smart Innovation Hub has been designed to support the creation and growth of innovation-led businesses and start-ups, alongside major new facilities that will enable the University to grow its established programme



of collaborative research, development and innovation support to local enterprises.
