Last month marked the fourth anniversary of Keele University's Business Gateway - the 'one-stop-shop' for local businesses and organisations to access Keele's knowledgeable academics, talented students and experienced business support experts.

Keele signs renewable energy partnership



Two wind turbines and 15,000 solar panels are set to be installed on the Keele University campus through a new partnership managed and financed by ENGIE, to support the University's pledge to be carbon neutral by 2030.

ENGIE, a leading energy and services company focused on producing and supplying low-carbon energy, has agreed a 25-year deal with Keele University to fund, design, build and operate a multi-technology energy park that will generate up to 50% of the University's campus electricity requirements from renewable sources.

The University's new low carbon energy project will see the development of two wind turbines, an industrial size battery for storing the generated energy, and 15,000 solar photovoltaic (PV) panels installed at ground level in fields on the edge of the campus which will be managed and financed by ENGIE.

After installation, the renewables will provide up to 50% of the campus electricity needs and the combined carbon emissions savings from the wind and solar farm will be around 1,500 tonnes per year – the equivalent of taking 800 cars off the road.

Excess electricity will be fed back to the local grid providing zero carbon energy to the local area, and the battery will help to balance the local and national electricity networks.
