Terms of Reference

Lay Involvement in Knowledge Mobilisation - LINK Group

AIMS:

To enable and support meaningful Patient and Public Involvement and Engagement (PPIE) in the implementation of research findings (knowledge mobilisation) for the benefit of the wider community

TERMS OF REFERENCE:

The LINK Working Party will support, lead and guide by:

- 1. Bringing together members of the patient groups and organisations we are trying to reach
- 2. Providing expertise on achieving the implementation of our research into practice, e.g. through networks. i.e all ages, any ethnicity/cultural background and experience of healthcare
- 3. Advising and co-producing the approach to PPIE, accelerating impact and ensuring best research evidence is translated into practice
- 4. Providing a forum for implementation issues in alignment with NIHR INVOLVE PPIE standards
- 5. Promoting the patient narrative throughout the whole research to implementation journey
- 6. Promoting the work of the LINK Group both internally e.g within the School of Medicine, Keele University and externally, e.g Collaboration for Leadership in NIHR West Midlands Applied Research Collaboration (WMARC)
- 7. Identifying additional skills and experiences that could support task and finish groups in the transfer of research findings into practice (Knowledge Mobilisation); agreeing final output prior to return to originator
- 8. Supporting the needs of LINK group members to fully engage and have a positive experience
- 9. Sharing of information to all stakeholders
- 10. Understanding changes in the health economy in a timely fashion

The LINK group will achieve these objectives by:

- 1. Supporting and guiding stakeholders to ensure timely and appropriate sharing and implementation of innovations
- 2. Supporting the Impact Accelerator Unit, Keele University, by establishing task and finish groups for implementation projects
- 3. Liaising with academic teams to ensure research results are summarised and given to RUG members to show outcomes, and clinical teams to support implementation of results into clinical pathways
- 4. Using media and communications to achieve success and promote work
