Changes to resources from NHS England

The NHS Core Content list of resources has been expanded to include:

- More titles added to the Oxford Medicine Online collection.
- eBooks added to the Kortext collection for the psychological professions
- A series of Fast Facts ebooks added to the Kortext collection, based on a range of conditions.
- AMED bibliographic database has moved from the Ovid platform to the Proquest Dialog platform (note that this is a different platform to the Proquest platform already in use).

NEJM Evidence

The Health Library has purchased the journal <u>NEJM Evidence</u>. This is a useful title for anyone wanting to improve their critical appraisal skills and who is interested in the research process. It is a monthly journal publishing case studies, original research, clinical trials and reviews but it goes beyond the trial, beyond the research paper. It includes exploration and analysis of the process of clinical trials and encourages critical analysis of research articles.

Unique content and features include:

Tomorrow's Trial – short articles highlighting accepted practices that lack solid evidence and invites clinician readers to propose clinical trials to fill those gaps

Patient Platform - patients who have been in a clinical trial, part of a research study, or had their care impacted strongly by these, share their thoughts on their experience

Stats, STAT! - animated videos explaining a fundamental statistical concept

BMJ Case Reports

A reminder that the Health Library purchases a subscription to BMJ Case Reports. You can view full-text of reports by logging in with your NHS OpenAthens username. You can also submit your own case report. This title is useful if looking for or sharing unusual clinical cases or unexpected outcomes and complications.
