
When: This role will run throughout August 2025.

We envisage a reasonably largescale, or impactful, artwork that members of the public can contribute to whilst visiting the show. We want this piece to develop through the run of the exhibition. It is important that this artwork encourages everyone to engage and is family friendly. There could be a worksheet version available for those who prefer to sit quietly and participate.

Audience / participants.


Many people attending the exhibition at present are adults, we would like to work with an artist to develop a family friendly activity to take place during the exhibition run, with a creative offer suitable for families with younger children but that can also be enjoyed by all visitors to the show. You must be comfortable in working with a range of age groups and artistic ability and have availability to be onsite for one day per week to encourage engagement and help develop the piece.

Dates.

The exhibition opens on Saturday 09 August and runs until Saturday 30 August. We open every week between Tuesday and Saturday, 11am – 3pm. The artwork will be available throughout this time for people to interact with and we would like the artist to attend and facilitate at least x4 sessions during the summer, one per week. Saturday 09 August is the launch day so ideally one of these x4 sessions will be on this date.
