

The Medicine Summer School 2019 code of conduct

This information should be read by the student who intends to participate in the Medicine Summer School 2019 and their parent/carer. Without both parties agreeing to the terms and conditions the student will not be allowed to attend the residential.

Expected behaviour

We want all students attending to enjoy the experience and gain an understanding of what it is like to be a university student. In order to do this the student will be expected to show responsible behaviour and respect the rights of other students, staff members and student ambassadors.

Rules and regulations

To ensure a safe environment for all attending the residential there are a number of rules and regulations to follow:

- At no point shall the student leave the university premises, unless permission has been granted by a Keele University staff member.
- Students are expected to follow any emergency procedure, such as a fire drill, as directed by Keele University staff.
- Alcohol must not be brought onto the Keele University site, nor shall students attempt to buy, sell or consume alcohol during the residential.
- Smoking is not permitted if you are under 18 years old.
- The purchase or use of any illegal substances is strictly forbidden.
- Abusive and anti-social behaviour or homophobic, sexist and racist language will not be tolerated under any circumstances.
- Students shall not vandalise or damage any property belonging to the University, staff or fellow students. I may be held liable for costs incurred through any wilful damage that I cause.
- Students are expected to remain in designated groups and to attend all activities.
- There will be separate accommodation blocks for male and female students. You are expected to keep to your own accommodation areas and be in your room at specified times.

In the event of a serious incident or if any of the above rules and regulations are broken then the student will not be allowed to continue with the Medicine Summer School residential, in this instance arrangements will be made for the student to be collected and taken home at your own expense.
