WHAT WE CAN OFFER ON CAMPUS


- 'Taster' sessions (for small groups)

 - An interactive discussion of the role of migration and border-crossing in modern cinema; how we understand it, and the kind of responses it encourages in us as viewers
- · Politics and the Action Film
- A participatory session which debates the political potential in the action movie's construction of urban space
