

Notes on Preparing Your Poster Presentation.

Please contact the local hosts (piningsuarez@gmail.com) for details of poster board dimensions et c.

Posters should be assembled on Saturday (4th March). There is an official **Poster Session** on **Sunday 5th March** in the evening. Posters should be displayed for the duration of the Meeting.

Posters which have been selected for a brief **oral communication** are allocated a period of **5 MINUTES** within an appropriate Platform Session. This period **must not be exceeded**. Session Chairs will interrupt anyone exceeding this time period. An additional period of **5 MINUTES** per Poster is allocated for questions. This generous allocation of time for discussion of your Poster presentation is a characteristic of the **Keele Meetings** which is usually appreciated by audience and speakers alike.

It cannot be used as an extension to the time allotted for your oral Poster contribution.

Oral Poster communications should use **electronic presentation**. Contact the local host (piningsuarez@gmail.com) if you have any questions about electronic presentation of your oral Poster contribution.

All new research (including concise, critical reviews of a field) presented at the Keele Meeting may be submitted for publication in a special Keele issue of the Journal of Inorganic Biochemistry.

Please note that this is a regular issue of the journal and that all submissions will be subject to the normal constraints of peer review. The Editor-in-Chief has asked that all submissions should emphasise the biochemical components of the research being presented.

The deadline for submission of manuscripts will be after the Meeting. If you are planning to submit your research to the Keele issue of JIB please let me (Chris Exley) know (c.exley@keele.ac.uk) and I will inform you of the submission requirements and deadlines.
