

Electronic Personal Development and Learning Plan: Handbook for Postgraduate Researchers

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1. Introduction

The Personal Development and Learning Plan (PDLP) is a record of a postgraduate researcher's (PGR) academic details such as the Supervisory Team, progress through formal milestones and changes to registration information.

The PDLP takes the form of a 'living' journal, accessible through the University's eVision system. It is a central electronic platform for a PGR to record their individual ongoing developmental & training needs, a log of targets and objectives and thesis progress.

It is therefore essential that both the PGR and the Lead Supervisor have a role in maintaining an oversight over the PGRs PDLP and keeping it up to date.

The electronic PDLP will be subject to periodic updates, such as format and additional features.


2. Accessing the PDLP

To Access the PDLP, you will need to log into your eVision account. Access to eVision is via:
<https://scims.keele.ac.uk/> where you will be asked to input your Keele username and password.


Click on the 'Course and Modules' tab.

3. Main PDLP Screen

From the main PDLP screen you will then be able to click on the tabs (as shown above) to access the different sections of the PDLP. You can also move from one tab to the next screen using the 'Next' button at the bottom of each screen.

4. Personal and Supervisory Details Tab

PDLP Section 1: Student details

This is the information that is held on your student record. If you believe that there are any errors please contact: studentrecords@keele.ac.uk

PDLP Section 2.1: Supervisory Team

These are the details of your Supervisory Team held on your student record.

To add details of your supervisors' expertise and contribution, choose from the drop down list the supervisor you want to add a description for.

Then in the 'Text to Add' box describe in detail the expertise your supervisor has in your research area. Consider how their expertise will contribute to your own research.

When you have added in your description, click the 'Update' button.

Note: After typing in your description, and before pressing 'Update', ensure that your information is correct. This cannot be changed after pressing the 'Update' button.

If you wish to add a further description, select the Supervisor from the drop down list. Then type in the 'Text to Add' box and click 'Update'. The most recent description added will be at the top of the Supervisor/ Co-Supervisor Expertise and Contribution field.

PDLP Section 2.2: Changes to Supervisory Team

Any changes to your Supervisor Team, following approval by the Faculty PGR Committee, will be shown here.

PDLP Section 2.3 Holiday Requests

This is a log of your holidays and time away from the University.

Note: After typing in your information, and before pressing 'Add Record', ensure that your information is correct. This cannot be changed after pressing the 'Add Record' button.


Previous Plans and Hours

5. Timetable Tab

PDLP Section 3: Timetable

This information is held on your student record and is automatically generated from the University's system.

PDLP Section 3.1: Formal Milestones

Formal Milestones are key events that show the progression of your research studies. The actual date will be shown after each Formal Milestone has been completed.

Please note, the timetable and formal milestone dates do not automatically update following a leave of absence or change in mode of attendance.

We are unable to rectify this issue currently and therefore suggest PGRs (whom this affects) use their Outlook diaries to manage deadlines.

For those PGRs who require Ethical Approval, you can enter the target date for Ethical approval. Enter the date and then click update.

* All research involving human participants, their tissues, or personal information must be approved by a recognised research ethics committee before the research can commence. This includes social science research (e.g. fieldwork-based, interview and questionnaire studies). 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To update the Target date for Ethical Approval, follow the same process as above.

PDLP Section 3.2: Interim Progress Reviews

This is pre-populated data that shows Target dates set and grades ratified by your Faculty PGR Committee.

Please note, Interim Progress Reviews are requested October and April every year, regardless of your start date so please disregard the deadlines noted in this section.

PDLP Section 3.3: Request for LOA or Extensions

This is pre-populated data that shows formal Leave of Absences (LOAs) and extensions to your maximum time as held on your student record.

PDLP Section 3.4: Changes to Mode of Attendance (MOA)

This is pre-populated data as held on your student record that shows your Mode of Attendance and any changes.

6. Learning Needs and Skill Development Tab

PDLP Section 4: Learning Needs and Skills Development Objectives

In this section, you will log your analysis of your research needs and how you will develop your skills needed for your research.

Your learning needs and skills can be categorised into four Research Development Framework (RDF) Domains (A-D) with a fifth (E) for other additional considerations. RDF Domains A-D each have subsets (1-3). See [The Vitae Researcher Development Framework - Vitae](#) for further details.

PDLP Section 4.1: Analysis of Needs and Objectives

To add a new RDF Domain Entry, from the drop down box choose the appropriate RDF Domain (A-E). Add in text in the 'Learning Needs, Skills, Development Objectives' field provide the RDF sub category and brief title. For example: 'A1 - Knowledge Base, Subject Knowledge'.

Then complete the 'How these needs and objectives will be met section.

When you have finished your description, click the 'Add' butt

You will then see your learning need in the corresponding RDF domain.

Note: Each time you add a new field it will be given a sequence number.

To edit a previously saved learning need, from the 'Select RDF Domain' drop down box choose the learning need you intend to edit.

7. Research Training Tab

PDLP Section 5.0: Record of Research Training and Skills Development

In this section, you will record your research training and development.

PhD PGRs enrolled on or after August 1st 2013 must complete a minimum of 200 hours training in personal development and employability skills (through accredited Keele modules (10 credits is equivalent to 100 hours), non-accredited courses in a variety of formats, or a mixture of both) plus any subject-specific requirements set by the Research Centre (see 5.2).

PDLP Section 5.1: Research training and skills development prior to registration

If you have any previous research training and skills approved by your Faculty PGR Committee this will show in this section.

PDLP Section 5.2: Record of Compulsory and Optional credit-bearing Modules

This is pre-populated data as held on your student record that shows the Modules you are taking at Keele.

PDLP Section 5.3: Research Training Log

To add a new module or training activity, complete each field, adding text in the boxes as appropriate in the 'Add a new module or training activity' Section.

When you have finished your description, click the 'Add' button.

PDLP Section 6.0: Plan and Record of Research Activities

In this section, you will record your research activities, targets and objectives.

PDLP Section 6.1: Research targets and objectives to be achieved

This is a list of your objectives and how you are tracking your targets to meet your objectives. Any changes to Objectives and Target dates are to be agreed in conjunction with your Lead Supervisor.

To add a Research Target, complete each field, adding text in the boxes as appropriate in the 'Add a new Research Target' Section. When you have finished your description, click the 'Add Target' button.

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10. Downloading your PDLP

We are aware the PDLP does not have a download option, and this is something we are unable to resolve currently.

To take a copy for your Interim and Progress Review 1,2 and 3 submissions, open your PDLP and select the three dots at the top right-hand corner of your screen.



Select 'print' and change the destination to 'save as PDF'. Work your way through, repeating for each tab on your PDLP.

Once you have the saved PDF tabs, combine them into a zip folder on your desktop and then you can upload to Skillsforge as part of your review.
