

## Schools are invited to consider these examples of how meetings with students are arranged

During 2021/22, 36% of UG examiners were able to meet students, either on campus or virtually. There were a number of reasons that 64% of UG examiners were unable to meet students including COVID, rail strikes and availability of externals/students.

'I am now entering my third full year as external examiner. It would be good if I were able to meet – virtually – some of the students on the course over the next twelve months' (History)

'Would be useful for this to be facilitated, on site, maybe combined with being able to attend practical/OSCE examinations, to see these assessment processes in action.' (Pharmacy)
