PANDA-S investigates a wide range of physical, psychological and social factors to determine which factors can help to identify people with poor prognosis, who may benefit from further treatment


WELCOME BACK!

We are now entering a critical phase of the study: there are just a few months of left to recruit the number of patients needed to generate valuable evidence regarding prognosis and management of this common, painful condition. **Your contribution is essential and highly appreciated**

The recruitment target has been revised and thanks to your efforts we are half-way to our new target!




Thank you for your continued support in identifying potential participants to the PANDA-S study!

Key reminders

- When a patient consults with shoulder pain, enter the relevant code to trigger the pop-up. **This can be done if your patient is consulting face-to-face or remotely**
- Participants will be asked to complete a series of questionnaires and will be given the option of reporting symptoms via an App/SMS and taking part in a qualitative interview (by telephone). **The option to attend a research clinic will not be offered at present**, but we are exploring the feasibility of reopening clinics.

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What have we been up to?

Whilst recruitment to PANDA-S was on hold, we were busy focusing on follow-up. We have moved all our paper-based questionnaires to an online platform and contacted participants to ask them to provide follow-up data online. This is proving to be popular with participants! So far, all the 12-month follow-up data has been provided online or over the telephone

What are we doing now?

The Clinical Trials Unit has reopened, and Zoe, our Project Administrator has been mailing study invitations to the people you have identified as being eligible and interested in the study, and logging completed questionnaires

Participants continue to engage in the study, with follow-up rates looking promising:

3-months: 78%

6-months: 70%

12-months: 69%
