





Food & Drink

Particular favourites include the daily specials in The Kitchen Table or the burgers from the KPA.








Sport & Active Wellbeing

What's provided in halls?

- All furniture in halls is provided (bed, wardrobe, desk & chair)
- All key appliances are provided in kitchen areas (ovens, fridges and freezers & microwaves)



What to bring

Duvet, pillow & bedding

Towels

Crockery, cutlery and cooking utensils

Homely items e.g. blankets, cushions, pictures (no candles!)

Cooking

- Bring the right equipment e.g. nonstick pans, baking trays, colander, chopping board & knife and scales
- Try to pick up some skills before you arrive
- Club together with your flat for the basics things like seasoning, bread, pasta etc. This will help to reduce waste too!
- If it all goes wrong and your meal doesn't go to plan, there's plenty of places to eat on campus and takeaways in the local area





Cleaning

Cleaning in halls

- Accommodation blocks are cleaned on weekdays. Be sure to check the notice board in your block for upto-date cleaning details
- Kitchens and bathrooms are cleaned every week
- It is the residents' responsibility to keep the accommodation clean and tidy
- You will need to empty the rubbish during weekends and bank holidays when cleaning staff are not on duty





Laundry

Using the laundrette

- To use the launderettes you need a laundry card for £2
- There are card dispenser machines points on campus in the Sports Centre and in Chancellor's
- Costs and approximate times are as follows:
 - The washing machines cost £2.70 and take around 40 minutes
 - The Tumble Dryers cost £1.10 and take around 30 minutes
- Once you have the card you will need to visit <u>www.circuit.co.uk</u> (the company who manage the launderettes) to top up your card
